THIS IS TO CERTIFY that at the regular session duly constituted pi the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, Province of Pangasinan, held on April 2, 1993, at Lingayen, Pangasinan, the following Provincial Ordinance was approved:

PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 23-93

CREATING THE PROVINCIAL ANTI-ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES TASK FORCE AND PROVIDING APPROPRIATIONS THEREFOR

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

WHEREAS, the provincial leadership under the stewardship of Covernor Aguedo F. Agbayani. Vice Governor Ranjit R. Shahani and the members of the Sangguniang Panlalavigan, including the Church, the Media, national government agencies, non-governmental organizations and the plain citizens are greatly alarmed by the unabated proliferation and existence of illegal activities such as jueting, illegal logging, illegal fishing, prostitution, etc.;

WHEREAS, the continued proliferation and existence of these vice corrodes the morale fiber of society particularly the youth;

WHEREAS, these forms of illegal activities hamatrung our economic growth and stability:

WHEREFORE, in view of the foregoing, on motion of SP Member Leonardo S. Caranto, duly seconded by Vice Governor Ranjit R. Shahami, it was -

RESOLVED, by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan in session assembled to enact:

- SECTION 1. The Provincial Ordinance No. 23-93 creating the Provincial Anti-Illegal Activities Task Force;
- SECTION 2. The primary objective of this Tusk Force is to abate, control or stop all kinds and forms of illegal activities such as the numbers game (justing), prostitution, illegal logging, illegal fishing, tupada, etc.;
- SECTION 3. The amount of \$100,000.00 is hereby appropriated for the operation of the Task Force;

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVITY - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately/after its approval.
