RESOLUTION NO. 29-2019

**APPROVING MUNICIPAL RESOLUTION NO. 321, S-2018
OF THE SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF LINGAYEN,
PANGASINAN, ENTITLED "APPROVING THE
MUNICIPAL ANNUAL INVESTMENT PROGRAM (AIP)
FOR CY 2019 OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF LINGAYEN,
PANGASINAN"**

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Bayan of Lingayen, Pangasinan submitted its Municipal Resolution No. 321, Series of 2018 to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan for review and evaluation pursuant to Section 56 of R.A. No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991;

WHEREAS, the Committee on Laws and Ordinances of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, with the technical assistance of the Provincial Planning and Development Officer, have conducted initial review and study on said resolution and found out that the same is in consonance to Sections 106, 109, 114 of RA 7160. The Local Development Council of Lingayen, Pangasinan had identified and prioritized programs and projects in their Annual Investment Program for CY 2019. This was endorsed to the Sangguniang Bayan for approval on July 5, 2018 thru MDC Resolution No. 1, S-2018 and was favorably acted upon by the Sangguniang Bayan on October 24, 2018 thru SB Resolution No. 321, S-2018;

WHEREAS, the Annual Investment Program of the municipality is in accordance with DBM-CCC-DILG JMC No. 2015-01 dated July 23, 2015 (*Revised Guidelines for Tagging/Tracking Climate Change Expenditures in the Local Budget*) as to format and content. The AIP of Lingayen, Pangasinan was



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formulated following the prescribed AIP Summary Form, and covers a) all the regular budgetary requirements for the operation of the different municipal offices broken down into: PS, MOOE and capital outlay, b) the priority development programs/projects of the LGU including those to be funded by the 20% development fund, c) Disaster Risk Reduction Programs/Projects/Activities, d) Local Climate Change Action Plan, e) Peace and Order Plan, and f) Activities in pursuance of the objectives of GAD, Local Council for the Protection of Children, and f) List of PPAs for Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities and PPAs to combat Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome;

WHEREAS, the proposed AIP of Lingayen for CY 2019 has a total investment requirement of P276,498,164.00, funding of which is embodied in their 2019 proposed Annual Budget and passed and approved by the Sangguniang Bayan on November 6, 2018 through Appropriation Ordinance No. 2, S-2018;

WHEREAS, this AIP is in accordance with Section 287 of RA 7160. More than twenty percent (24.13%) of the LGUs IRA (P212,883,164.00) which is equivalent to P54,368,098.00 is allocated for development projects;

WHEREAS, the development projects proposed to be funded by the 20% development fund were based on the DILG-DBM Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2017-1, dated February 22, 2017 entitled "Updated Guidelines on the Appropriation and Utilization of the 20% of the Annual Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) for Development Projects";

WHEREAS, the disaster risk reduction and management plan, in preparation and to mitigate the impact of disasters proposed to be funded by the 5% LDRRMF (P12,739,909.00), is in conformity to Section 21 of RA 10121. The programs, projects and activities to be funded by 20% of the 5% LDRRMF in the amount of P8,917,936.30 conform with NDRRMC-DBM-DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2013-1 dated March 25, 2013 of the Department of the Interior and Local Government (Allocation and Utilization of the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund);

WHEREAS, the LGU of Lingayen has also identified programs/projects/activities which are responsive to climate change and tagged its corresponding expenditures in their AIP. This is in pursuance to DBM-CCC-DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2015-01 dated July 23, 2015;

WHEREAS, the Gender and Development Programs and Activities (GAD-PPAs) attached were reviewed by the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) Provincial Office, and were found to be fully compliant in form and in content with the provisions of the DBM-PCW-DILG-NEDA Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2013-01 re "Guidelines on the Localization of Magna Carta of Women";



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WHEREAS, the AIP also includes programs/projects/activities proposed to be funded by the national government agencies and other funding institutions in the amount of P1,891,719,475.00;


WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, after final evaluation, finds the subject resolution in order;

WHEREFORE, in view of the foregoing, on motion of SP Members Raul P. Sison and Nestor D. Reyes and co-sponsored by SP Members Sheila Marie S. Perez-Galicia, Jerome Vic O. Espino and Arth Bryan C. Celeste, duly seconded, it was –


