RESOLUTION NO. 449-2022

APPROVING RESOLUTION NO. 16, S-2022 OF THE SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF DASOL, PANGASINAN, ENTITLED “APPROVING THE ANNUAL INVESTMENT PROGRAM (AIP) CY-2022 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT (LGU) OF DASOL, PANGASINAN”

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Bayan of Dasol, Pangasinan submitted its SB Resolution No. 16, S-2022 to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan for review and evaluation pursuant to Section 56 of Republic Act No.7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991;

WHEREAS, the Committee on Laws and Ordinances of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan with the technical assistance of the Provincial Planning and Development Officer have conducted initial review and study on said SB Resolution with the following findings:

1. Subject resolution is in consonance to Sections 106, 109 and 114 of the Local Government Code (LGC) of 1991. The Local Development Council of Dasol, Pangasinan had identified and prioritized programs and projects in their Annual Investment Program for CY 2022. This was endorsed by the Local Development Council to the Sangguniang Bayan on October 18, 2021 thru MDC Resolution No. 3, Series of 2021;
2. The Annual Investment Program of the municipality is in accordance with the Budget Operations Manual (BOM) for Local Government Units – 2016 Edition and in pursuance to DILG-NEDA-DBM-DOF Joint Memorandum Circular No. 1 Series of 2007 dated 08 March 2007 and DBM-CCC-DILG JMC No. 2014-01 dated August 7, 2014, as amended



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by DBM-CCC-DILG JMC No. 2015-1 – dated July 23, 2015 as to format and contents. The AIP of Dasol, Pangasinan was formulated following the prescribed AIP Summary Form and covers a) all the regular budgetary requirements for the operation of the different municipal offices broken down into PS, MOOE and Capital Outlay; b) the priority development programs/projects of the LGU including those to be funded by the 20% development fund; c) disaster risk reduction programs, projects and activities; d) Peace and Order Plan; e) Gender and Development Plan; f) Nutrition Plan; g) Local Climate Change Action Plan, h) Municipal Tourism and Cultural Plan; and i) list of programs, projects and activities (PPAs) for the Local Culture and Arts, Local Council for the Protection of Children, Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities. It is advised however, that the LGU concerned shall also include other attachments to the AIP as per Section 2.2.17 of Local Budget Memorandum No. 82, dated June 14, 2021, namely: Local Youth Development Plan and List of PPAs to address problems on Illegal Drugs;

3. The proposed AIP of Dasol for CY 2022 has an investment requirement of P190,953,463.35 Funding support for the implementation of which is embodied in their 2022 proposed Annual Budget, which was passed and approved by their Sangguniang Bayan on February 22, 2022 thru Appropriation Ordinance No. 175, Series of 2022 and approved by the Municipal Mayor on March 2, 2022;
4. This AIP is in accordance with Section 287 of LGC of 1991. Twenty percent (20%) of the LGU's National Tax Allotment (P179,553,753.000), which is equivalent to P35,910,750.60 is allocated for development projects. These development projects are based on Joint DBM-DOF-DILG Memorandum Circular No. 1, dated November 4, 2020 (Revised Guidelines on the Appropriation and Utilization of the Twenty Percent (20%) of the Annual Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) for Development Projects);
5. The Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Programs/Projects/Activities in preparation for and to mitigate the impact of disasters to be funded by the 5% LDRRM Fund (P9,547,995.15) were based on Section 21 of RA 10121. The programs, projects and activities to be funded by 70% of the 5% LDRRMF in the amount of P6,683,596.60 were based on NDRRMC-DBM-DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2013-1 dated March 25, 2013 of the Department of Interior and Local Government. (Allocation and Utilization of the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund.) The LDRRM Plan was reviewed and evaluated by Office of Civil Defense (OCD) as per Local Budget Memorandum No. 77, dated May 15, 2018 and Local Budget Memorandum No. 82, dated June 14, 2021;



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6. The LGU of Dasol had also identified programs, projects and activities responsive to Climate Change and tagged its corresponding expenditures in their AIP. This is in pursuance to DBM-CCC-DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2015-01 dated July 23, 2015;
7. The Gender and Development Programs, Projects and Activities (GAD-PPAs) attached were reviewed by the DILG Provincial Office and were found to be fully compliant in form and in contents with the provisions of the Joint Memo-Circular (DBM, PCW, DILG & NEDA) No. 2016-01: Amendments to JMC 2013-01 or the Guidelines on the Localization of the Magna Carta of Women; and
8. As to the Devolution Transition Plan (2022-2024), as one of the supporting documents of this AIP, it is respectfully recommended that the LGU shall strictly observe Item 3.2 of DBM Local Budget Memorandum No. 82-A dated August 19, 2021 which states that “Considering the timeline on the preparation and submission of the LGU DTP under DBM-DILG JMC No. 2021-1, the LCE shall not be mandatorily required to include the LGU DTP as part of the supporting documents of the AIP and the LEP to be submitted to the local sanggunian for budget authorization purposes. However, in case the LGU has already prepared and approved its LGU-DTP, the same may be part of the supporting documents of the AIP and LEP to be submitted by the LCE to the local sanggunian”. Further, item 6.3.2 of the DBM-DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2021-1 dated August 11, 2021 advised LGUs to “integrate fully assumed responsibilities in the updating of their local development plans, sectoral thematic plans and investment programs”.

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, after final evaluation, finds the subject resolution in order, however, compliance with all the existing laws, rules and regulations shall be the responsibility of the Municipal Government of Dasol, Pangasinan;

WHEREFORE, in view of the foregoing, on motion of SP Members Donabel N. Fontelera and Margielou Orange D. Humilde-Verzosa and co-sponsored by SP Members Sheila Marie S. Perez-Galicia, Jerome Vic O. Espino and Jeanne Jinky C. Zaplan, duly seconded, it was—

RESOLVED, by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan in session assembled, to approve Resolution No. 16, S-2022 of the Sangguniang Bayan of Dasol, Pangasinan, entitled “Approving the Annual Investment Program (AIP) CY-2022 of the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Dasol, Pangasinan”;




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
